

Terms & Conditions

1. This competition is being organised by re:Written, an editorial business based in the United Kingdom. The email address for the competition is flashfic@rewritten.uk.
2. To enter, please send your original, unpublished flash fiction story, in English, of between 50 and 200 words. Entries above or below this word count will not be considered.
3. The organiser reserves the right to exclude material which readers may find offensive, such as extreme violence or pornography. (The organiser is not a prude by any means, but she does have some red lines.)
4. This competition is open to published and unpublished authors. There is no limit to the number of entries that may be submitted by a single author, but the material must not have been published before.
5. By submitting your entry, you agree and warrant that (i) your entry has not been published before; (ii) your entry is entirely your own original work; and (iii) nothing in your entry is defamatory, private or an infringement of copyright or other intellectual property right or in any way a breach of another's rights. Any entry in breach of this clause will be disqualified.
6. The competition operates on a rolling schedule. A new pair of entries will be shared on the first day of each month (providing sufficient new material is available) and voting will be open for the rest of that calendar month.
7. All submissions will be considered for inclusion but depending on the number of entries, may not be published on the site. There may be a delay of several months before successful submissions are published.
8. The winner of each month's competition will be decided by online votes cast by visitors to the site. The entry that receives the most votes will be declared the winner. Winners will be notified by email.
9. All entrants retain the copyright to their work. Authors grant re:Written a non-exclusive licence to publish their entries, in whole or in part, on its website and social media.
10. There are no material prizes for winning. Sorry.
11. But look on the bright side. It costs nothing to enter.
12. The organiser is not responsible for entries lost, misdirected, delayed or destroyed.
13. If insufficient entries of an adequate standard are available, the organiser reserves the right to postpone a scheduled competition until the following month.
14. The email address of entrants will only be used for the purpose of administering the competition. It will not be used for marketing purposes unless explicit permission is given via the checkbox on the entry form. It will absolutely, definitely not be shared with third parties, ever.
